



After logging in select the Reports tab on the landing page.




The Reports are organized into 3 main sections that follow the problem-solving process, including Screening and Problem Identification, Analysis and Planning, and Intervention and Monitoring. Reports for each section are in one or two columns and can be seen by scrolling down the page.


There are 6 reports that relate to screening and problem identification. Each of these reports provides information about all of the students in a class, grade, school, or district, These reports assist teams by showing the percentages and names of students who met the learning standard for their grade level and which ones did not. Some of the screening reports are specific to certain assessments. The key feature of reports in this section is information about which students might benefit from additional instruction or intervention.



The reports in this section provide details about what skills individual students need to learn as well as the performance on items on the assessments for all students in a class. The Group Skills report helps teachers know which content has been mastered by most students in a class and which ones need to be re-taught because too few students have mastered them. The key feature of reports in this section is that they help teachers know what type of instruction or intervention students need.



These reports provide information about individual student progress. By showing student data for screening, progress monitoring, and both, teachers can learn if efforts to improve outcomes are working. These reports are ones that can also be shared with parents.



FastBridge reports can be used for both group-level and individual student instruction planning. It is best to start with reviewing group-level data in order to learn how effective Tier 1 core instruction is for all students. Individual student reports can be sent home to parents and show student response to instruction changes. Where allowed by state and district policies, such data can be used as part of the process for identifying a student's eligibility for special education.
