

Creating equitable opportunities is dependent upon having inclusive policies and practices that **represent** all students, and providing each student increased **access** to and creating meaningful **participation** in high-quality learning experiences where each student realizes positive **outcomes**.


- Prioritize equity: Set and communicate a vision and targets for high outcomes for all students.
- 2. Start from within: Focus on leadership, diversity and inclusiveness.
- Measure what matters: Use relevant and meaningful data. Hold each other accountable for equity.
- Go local: Engage and develop leaders at all levels. Empower community partners in the continuous improvement work.
- Follow the money: Allocate resources to learners who need them most.
- 6. Start early: Invest in families and learners early on.
- Monitor equitable implementation of standards: Improve the quality of curriculum and instruction for all students.
- Value people: Focus on teachers and leaders. Develop the people you have. Ensure equitable access to the best teachers.
- Improve conditions for learning: Focus on school culture, climate and social-emotional development. Connect teaching to the experiences, assets and needs of students.
- Give students options: Empower students with high-quality options to support every learner's success.

2024-25 Action Steps:

- Reading Center pilot with KW parents
- KW Kindergarten Round Up
- Provide or Access Parent Resources relating to early reading strategies given at Early Childhood Screenings
- Using liaisons to make Early Childhood Screening accessible to parents interpretation and translation, emotional support and building relationships

23-24 GOAL: 100% of kindergarten students will meet grade level expectations for developmental milestones as measured by FASTBridge by May 2023 assessment window.

23-24 OUTCOME:

• **SAEBRS:** 75% of students in grades kindergarten were proficient.

24-25 GOAL: 100% of kindergarten students will meet grade level expectations as measured by SAEBRS FASTBridge by May 2025 assessment window.

23-24 GOAL: 100% of students assessed with FastBridge's aReading and aMath assessments in the Spring of 2024 will meet reading and math targets.

23-24 OUTCOME:

- aReading: 42% of students in grades 2-8 were proficient.
- **aMath:** 36% of students in grades 2-8 were proficient.

24-25 GOAL: 100% of students assessed with FastBridge's aReading and aMath assessments in the Spring 2025 will meet reading and math targets.

2024-25 Action Steps:

- Utilize Defined Careers with all students
- Intake meetings with staff for new students
- Revise Careers Course to implement PLPs for every student that enrolls in Careers
- Staff will assist students with progress monitoring these goals.
- From the inventory, they will all create a career and education goal in either their IEP or CLP. Staff will assist students with progress monitoring these goals.
- Implement a mentorship program with students who might be interested in a non-traditional career field (Welding, Construction, Manufacturing, Information Technology, etc.) with a professional in that career field.

23-24 GOAL: 100% of 5RO & River Bluff students will create and monitor a career and education goal in their CLP or IEP.

23-24 OUTCOME: 100%

24-25 GOAL: 100% of 5RO & River Bluff students will create and monitor a career and education goal in their CLP, IEP, or PLP.



All students graduate from high school.

2024-25 Action Steps:

- Focus on local data accuracy to individualize supports
- High School Counselor meets with students yearly to discuss PLP adding a car
- Social Workers trained in Check in Connect.
- Boystown utilized by River Bluff staff
- 5RO Staff meet with seniors monthly to check progress towards graduation.
- Adding a student success coordinator at 5RO

23-24 GOAL: 100% of students will graduate on time, whether they are in a 4 year or 6 year cohort.

23-24 OUTCOME: 76.5% graduated within 7 years

24-25 GOAL: 100% of students will graduate within 7 years.

23-24 GOAL: The grades 3-8 students (participating in universal benchmarking) at River Bluff Education Center, including 5 Rivers Online, will increase from a baseline Student Growth Percentile (grade level peers) of 32 SGP to 40 SGP when measured by the FAST Bridge Learning aReading assessment from Fall 2023 to Spring 2024.

23-24 OUTCOME:

• **SGP:** Students achieved a median SGP of **39.5**.

24-25 GOAL: Increase the median Student Growth Percentile (SGP compared to grade level peers) of grades 3-8 students at River Bluff Education Center and 5RiversOnline to 40, as measured by the FAST Bridge Learning aReading assessment from Fall 2024 to Spring 2025.
