What: State Standards

How: Evidence-based instructional strategies; common materials; differentiated instruction

Who: All students

Tier 1 = Universal Tier = Core

Take turns giving reasons it is important to have a strong Tier 1.


Rationale

All Students


If Tier 1 is about the state standards, even students with IEPs are working toward those standards.



Specially Designed Instruction

Specially designed instruction (SDI) means adapting, as appropriate, to the needs of an eligible child under this part, the content, methodology, or delivery of instruction to address the unique needs of a child that results from the child's disability; and to ensure access of the child to the general curriculum, so that he or she can meet the



What percentage of students meet benchmark targets?


Strong Tier 1

At least 80% of students meet Tier 1 targets.

Looking only at students who met the fall benchmark target, what percentage met the spring benchmark target?

Strong Tier 1

At least 95% of students who met the fall target meet the spring target.

Growth Comparisons




